## Council Backs Local Sporting Clubs

Alexandrina Council has committed to supporting local sporting clubs by approving \$68,000 funding to the Goolwa Netball and Goolwa Tennis Clubs. Without this funding, the future of both sports utilising the current courts was in doubt, as the netball club feared it would not be able to play on its home courts this season due to the condition of the playing surface and non-compliance with court sizing.

The Goolwa Netball Club shares a facility with the Goolwa Tennis Club in the Recreation Grounds and both clubs have provided sporting experiences via netball and tennis to generations of community members since 1963.

The shared courts have gone without upgrades for 20 years and the bitumen surface had deteriorated so much that multiple injuries have occurred. The former bitumen surface was aged and uneven, and continued to deteriorate due to weather and physical contact during sport. Both clubs were undertaking preventative measures by sweeping courts prior to each game.

Now, work has started on the court upgrade project, which includes extending and resurfacing the courts, new fencing and new lighting. The lighting is being replaced as they were damaged due to a fire in 2017, highlighting how dangerous the out-of-date facility had become.

The netball club was successful in obtaining \$34,000 funding from the Office of Recreation and Sport and a further \$15,000 has been pledged by the Goolwa and District Community Bank. The club will be contributing \$28,000.

The Goolwa Netball Club has over 150 playing members ranging in ages from five to 59 years. It participates in the Great Southern Netball Association and hosts nine home games per year in line with the Goolwa/Port Elliot Football Club. The Goolwa Tennis club has approximately 50 playing members and also hosts home games. Both clubs have a very strong focus on junior development and providing a safe, inclusive and enjoyable experience in sport for all club members.

The facility is also used by social sporting groups in tennis for over 50s and after school programs, such as Active Club, Net Set Go (Netball SA Junior program) ANZ Hot Shots (Tennis SA junior development), as well as being available for hire to the public for social events.

There was an air of excitement in Strathalbyn as Council officially opened the new Strathalbyn Woodshed in March, and celebrated with the dedicated Strathalbyn Woodshed Committee and members of the community.

Decked out with fantastic equipment including a range of lathes, sanding machines, bandsaws, and an array of hand tools; the Woodshed is ready to turn out some fine pieces and projects to match the members' imagination and craftsmanship.

Council is enormously proud to have funded the community facility and is encouraging of the collaborative opportunities it will offer other Strathalbyn community groups. The Woodshed promotes a community focus of togetherness, values shared experiences, and provides the platform for members to broaden their skills. Members will participate in grassroots projects, events and programs for the benefit of the whole community, which, in turn, fosters a sense of accomplishment, purpose and achievement.

The Woodshed Committee members are ecstatic about the prospects, opening the door to a much larger program of events and activities, and the chance to work with numerous community

clubs and groups, including the Strathalbyn Scout Group. Since the Woodshed's 'shell' was completed in June last year, Committee members and tradesmen have worked tirelessly on the interior finishes to present impressive work stations, tool storage areas and a functional kitchen.

One of the greatest advantages of the new location will undoubtedly be its increased availability. As it is no longer in a residential area, the facilities can be used well into the evenings without noise restrictions.

With the Woodshed's official opening fulfilled, we anticipate seeing the program evolve, and events developed for the entire Strathalbyn community to enjoy.

While the shed operates as a traditional 'Men's Shed', women are also very welcome and encouraged to join and participate in an environment which aims to promote a significant social, emotional and creative environment for retirees in the community.


## Gazania Free Goolwa

Have you noticed just how many Gazanias grow in our region? Gazanias are a low growing plant, characterised by their large yellow or orange flowers. They have become so common many people don't realise the threat they pose to our local environment. Most common along the coastal strip, Gazanias can quickly invade gardens, roadside verges and native bushland.

Council staff and community volunteers spend many hours removing Gazanias from bushland reserves and the Goolwa dunes. We focus our removal efforts on areas of high conservation value, but we need the community's help to reduce the weed threat. Gazanias growing in private gardens produce seed which can be spread by the wind up to 1km away.

This is why Alexandrina Council, the Goolwa to Wellington Local Action Planning Association, Goolwa CoastCare and the Alexandrina Community Nursery have launched the "Gazania Free Goolwa" campaign. We are encouraging residents in the Goolwa area to remove Gazanias from their gardens and replant with local native species.

Residents of Goolwa can trade in their weeds, by participating in the Gazania Plant Swap. By taking Gazanias from their gardens to the collection point at Alexandrina Community Nursery on Kessell Road, Goolwa (open on Friday 9am – 5pm), each household is eligible to receive ten free native plants for their garden. The number of participating households is limited, so don't delay.



The official launch of the campaign will be a fun family day during the April school holidays. The Great Gazania Grab, to be held on 22 April 2018, will feature food, music, competitions, games and of course a chance to help us grab the Gazanias growing near the dunes at Goolwa Beach.

We will also celebrate community participation in the campaign via a Gazania Free Garden competition. The competition will be based on photographs of local gardens in three categories: best garden, best photo and most improved garden. More details of the competition will be released in the coming weeks.

## Thriving in Agriculture

We acknowledge and celebrate the extraordinary, creative and vital role that women play in agriculture and farm communities across our region.

It is great to see more women thriving in the Agriculture industry and Council was delighted to support the sector by providing part funding for two of our local agricultural women to attend the Thriving Women Conference held in February.

Attendees Alice Morley and Melissa Rebbeck, were selected by Alexandrina Sustainable Agricultural Round Table (ASART) members as recipients of Council's financial support.

Alice and Melissa have both worked in Agriculture for 20 years. Melissa received an award at the Fleurieu and Kangaroo Island Women's Community Achievement Awards in March, and was a finalist in the South Australian Agricultural Innovation Award in November. The local award acknowledges the work that Melissa does for community groups including supporting the development of the Fleurieu Forward Farming Group, and her volunteer work with the Fleurieu Beef Group and the Ranges to River Natural Resources Management Group.

Alice specialises in animal health and agronomy, performing a vital consulting role in her work at FP Ag. She hopes to assist more women in the agricultural field and help turn the tables,

gaining respect and recognition, in what is traditionally a male dominant industry. Alice has already earned great respect from her male counterparts. We can be very proud of these amazing and inspiring women.

Armed with wisdom and knowledge from the conference we look forward to seeing how Alice and Melissa will impact and drive agricultural pursuits throughout our community.

Melissa was inspired by Dr Kate Fennell for her focus on improving the health and wellbeing of people living in rural areas. This was particularly relevant to Melissa and she feels driven to explore and emphasise the important links between soil health and human health. Given our current health crisis, we need to seriously consider restoring the integrity of our food. There is quite a movement now with farmers actively seeking to understand the difference between chemical farming and biological farming. Healthy soils grow food that ensure correct uptake of nutrients and exclusion of toxins. Regenerative farming is a crucial direction for the sector to embrace.

## Changes to Dog and Cat Laws

**D**og registration has been simplified. New laws and rules for cat and dog owners will come into effect on 1 July 2018 and include:

- Mandatory microchipping of dogs and cats
- Desexing of dogs and cats born after 1 July 2018
- New rules for breeders who sell dogs and cats
- Introduction of a state-wide database, called Dogs and Cats Online
- Registration and renewals will be online through the Dog and Cat Management Board, no longer through local councils.

These new laws will streamline dog registration processes, make it easier to reunite lost dogs and cats with their owners, help identify and put a stop to puppy farms, and reduce euthanasia rates.

### Microchipping

From 1 July, owners must microchip their dogs and cats by 12 weeks of age or at the point of sale. Veterinarians may exempt an animal for medical reasons. Owners are encouraged to take advantage of the numerous discount microchipping days throughout the state. ### Desexing

Dogs and cats born after 1 July 2018 must be desexed by six months of age or 28 days after purchase by the owner. Working livestock dogs as well as dogs and cats owned by registered breeders will be exempt from the requirement to desex, however will still need to be microchipped.

### Breeders

People who breed dogs and cats for sale after 1 July 2018 must register with the Dog and Cat Management Board as a breeder. Your breeder registration number must be included in all advertisements for dogs and cats. There are new requirements to disclose the breeder registration number and other information to the buyer at the point of sale. All breeders are required to follow the new industry standards and guidelines.

### Dogs and Cats Online

From 1 July 2018, Dogs and Cats Online will be the central database for microchipped and registered dogs and cats, and registration payments. Dogs and Cats Online will also be the register of breeders.

Existing dog owners should receive a renewal notice in the mail during July 2018 with their dog's new lifetime registration disc (replacing the annual disc) and instructions on how to complete their annual dog registration on Dog and Cats Online. If you do not receive a renewal notice for your dog, please contact Council.

## Economic Development on Hindmarsh Island

In recognition that Hindmarsh Island is a unique part of our region, Council hosted the inaugural Hindmarsh Island Economic Development Forum in February. The event was very well attended by those currently involved, or known to have an active interest in, tourism, environment, business enterprise or land development on the Island.

In just a few months, the Alexandrina economy is expected to reach the milestone of \$1 billion per annum. Within five years, Alexandrina Council is likely to have an annual turnover of \$50 million making it one of the State's largest regional councils. In ten years, the Alexandrina community is projected to grow to more than 30,000 people, being a destination of choice for new residents to the Fleurieu Peninsula. So, now, it is time to look to the future of which the Hindmarsh Island Economic Development Forum was designed to do.

Alexandrina Council's Chief Executive Officer, Glenn Rappensberg, shared his thoughts on Council's role in fostering economic development and upcoming initiatives relevant to Hindmarsh Island. Other subject-matter experts from across the public and private sectors shared their insight using case studies to highlight opportunities for Hindmarsh Island. Ngarrindjeri business man, Clyde Rigney Junior shared his aspirations for cultural tourism; John Carter, Managing Director of Mill Hill Capital provided an overview of the vision for Coorong Quays; and Sarah Lance from DENWR highlighted nature-

based tourism opportunities with a particular focus on the recently declared Lawari Conservation Park.

The forum provided an opportunity for attendees to hear first-hand about planned initiatives and potential opportunities, to share their perspective and ideas, and to network with others.

One of the key issues discussed on the day was land use planning. Participants were provided with an overview of Council's Development Plan as it relates to Hindmarsh Island and from a State perspective, the new Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act and associated Environment and Food Production Area, as well as some of the regulations and considerations contained in each.

It was a successful day of sharing aspirations and ideas, opportunities and challenges - a positive conversation starter that will inform Council's future thinking and decision making. We sincerely thank all those who attended for their active involvement.



### STRATHALBYN WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT EXPANSION


