We have continued to collaborate and create opportunities for local businesses to provide unique offerings throughout April. Business Alexandrina has worked with small businesses to make April the month to explore locally with over 160 events celebrating our arts, food, wine, tourist experiences, and natural beauty scheduled in the lead up to the SA Wooden Boat Festival at Alexandrina Cove on 29 and 30 April.

Exciting infrastructure projects will progress across the region including the Strathalbyn Town Centre Revitalisation, commencement of the Goolwa Wharf Precinct Project including the Signal Point Experience Centre, Beacon 19 Boat Ramp, Goolwa Beach Carpark and Environs Master Plan, Goolwa Oval Recreation Precinct and smaller projects including a new playground at the Milang Foreshore.

We look forward to awarding our Heritage Awards in May during History Month and the first meetings for two new Section 41 committees (Climate Emergency and Environment, and Heritage Advisory). Thank you to all that submitted nominations and welcome all members.

For all our young, budding writers out there, the annual Mayor's Short Story Challenge is open for submissions between May 1 to 7 July. I can't wait to read the stories from our local young people and celebrate the winners in September.

As the weather cools, the leaves change and we anticipate the upcoming whale season, there is so much to be celebrated in this edition.

# Goolwa Wharf Precinct Project – It's time to build!

It is full steam ahead for the Goolwa Wharf Precinct and construction will start in April 2023. It is thought to be the biggest asset restoration project in the history of Council. Works will include the wharf decking re-construction, Wharf Shed remediation and Signal Point building roof remediation. It is estimated that over 80% of the funding for the project will be spent on much needed restoration of existing assets.

The Wharf Shed's internal space will be split in half with the PS Oscar W volunteers and the commercial tenant, each being allocated five bays. The space allocation was an important detail to clarify for the project with both current tenants being key to achieving the Goolwa Wharf Precinct project's vision to create a place to experience a vibrant riverfront township enriched with culture and history.

We will continue to move forward with the project to meet the tight completion timeframes required by the \$5M grant funding received for the project and the \$980,000 grant funding received for the Signal Point Experience Centre. The Project Team are working closely with all precinct stakeholders as we prepare for the upcoming staged construction plans including a timetable for the building phase that allows continuing access by the public, maintains business operations and manages impacts from construction activities. Project completion is anticipated in early 2024.

## **Local Immunisation Clinics**

Alexandrina Council runs immunisation clinics, on behalf of SA Health, to administer free Japanese encephalitis virus (JEV) vaccines for eligible people.

Over 2,000 JEV vaccinations have been administered since October 2022. Japanese encephalitis is a rare but serious disease caused by the Japanese encephalitis virus (JEV). Whilst this disease has a vaccine many other mosquito borne diseases do not. You can "Fight the Bite" to protect yourself and your family against mosquito bites and mosquito borne diseases by:

- Cover up by wearing long, loose fitting clothing
- Repel using insect repellent
- Eliminate the water that mosquitoes can breed in around the home.

# Children and Young People in Alexandrina

Coordinated by Reclink Australia, young people meet every Friday during school term 4.30-6pm for an afternoon of fun and connection over activities ranging from sports, art to board games and more.

The program aims to increase health, personal development, social connection and inclusion amongst youth in Milang and surrounding areas. Home base for the Youth Program is the Milang Youth Hub, formerly Old Regatta Yacht Club. It is a fantastic space to come down and join in the activities. # Middleton 2022 Storm Event

The November 2022 storm event on the Fleurieu was sudden and severe. It resulted in significant damage to properties, businesses and infrastructure across South Australia.

Following a community meeting with those directly affected in Middleton, it was acknowledged that Council's focus needed to shift from Infrastructure to the people, the community we serve.

Council remain committed to continuing the recovery process and by working together with other lead agencies and community to understand what happened, and make improvements to better prepare our region for future extreme weather events.

### **Transport for our community**

Alexandrina Council provides funding each year to support the provision of community transport services for eligible residents.

If you are transport disadvantaged, you may be able to access support to get to medical appointments with Medi Ride or to the local shops via the Community Shopping Bus. Southern Communities Transport Scheme (SCOTS) provides a community bus service on Thursdays and Friday for coastal residents and the Hills Community Transport service regularly take Strathalbyn residents to shopping centres outside of the town. Visit Council's website to check eligibility criteria. Concerns about public transport are frequently raised by Alexandrina residents in our region. Although Council is not a transport service provider, it does play an important advocacy role on behalf of the community.

In 2022 Council prepared a submission to the Select Committee on Public and Active Transport, Parliament of South Australia. It included the evidence Council has collected regarding our community's views on public transport in the region. Many points in the submission have been reflected in the final report and its recommendations, including the need to:

- Increase the frequency and improve the connectivity of bus services in regional areas.
- Have fair and equitable fares for regional passengers
- Improve cycling infrastructure, including in regions.
- Promote alternatives to car travel to improve community wellbeing and reduce carbon emissions.

# **Regenerating Our Food System**

Food connects all of us. From paddock to plate and beyond, our local food system is a complex, integrated network of food production, processing, distribution, consumption, and resource recovery.



We are excited to share our region's vision for a regenerative and resilient local food system, built with business and community. The vision was developed through the Our Local Food System workshop, the Agribusiness Innovation Conversation, and the Yannun (Yarning) Circle with First Nations held October 2021 to May 2022.

It is a vision for a future food system that brings positive outcomes for our people, economy and environment.

It sees us able to respond to climate change, reduce our dependence on distant food sources, and ensure access to affordable, nutritious food for all.

Alexandrina is known for our fabulous food and food culture, and there is a role for community, businesses and Council in bringing this vision to life. The priority areas which have emerged as part of this vision present opportunities for residents, businesses and community. They are:

- Enabling regenerative farming
- Supporting local food
- Encouraging sustainable planning and design

- Reducing food waste
- Learning alongside First Nations
- Facilitating education and awareness.

We hope it inspires you as much as it does us. The workshops and conversations were a first step to better understand the food system and co-create a regenerative food future. The journey has only just begun.

We have been working on taking steps towards realising the vision, working in partnership with organisations such as Regional Development Australia – Hills, Fleurieu & Kangaroo Island whose mandate is to foster liveability and a thriving economy within our region; and The Food Embassy, a Fleurieu-based social enterprise focused on building a regenerative food system through education, events and collaborative projects.

Under the "Supporting local food" theme of our vision, together we are exploring the current logistics challenges and opportunities for small food and wine enterprises in the Fleurieu region.

# Look out for Alexandrina's new Library services caddy

# Major project updates



### Lot 10, Strathalbyn

Earmarked as a recreational precinct, the Council owned land at Lot 10 Langhorne Creek Road, Strathalbyn will have a business case and Infrastructure Investigation Report developed. These reports will assist Council make informed future decisions on its development, including the cost and any constraints for potential infrastructure on the land. ### **Strathalbyn Town Centre Revitalisation**

The eight stage project is progressing on schedule with Swale Street now complete. Upcoming works will include the Dawson Street precinct (Stage 4.2) commencing in May 2023. Works will entail intersection and stormwater upgrades, improved pedestrian connectivity, new footpath paving, additional lighting, garden beds, trees and street furniture. The intersection will be closed during June and July 2023 and final stages commencing in August include parking and Town Hall upgrades. On track from completion in late 2023.

### Goolwa Oval - Stage 2

In March, brand new LED lighting towers and digital LED multi-use scoreboard were installed at the oval, as well as new 12m goal posts and behind-the-goals netting in readiness for the commencement of the 2023 season. Upcoming works will include removal of the four tennis courts adjacent the wetland, the public toilet facility on the west corridor, existing cricket practice nets, Lions book shed, the storage shed and play equipment. These works will pave the way for the exciting new tennis and netball courts, new cricket practice nets and new storage facilities for cricket, netball and tennis equipment. A new play space will be constructed adjacent the new tennis and netball courts, with a landscape boulevard entry and green open space.
