It has been a busy few months at Council with progress made on a range of infrastructure projects and a significant level of maintenance tasks being undertaken following a wetter than average winter.

A number of major projects are progressing well around the region including the Strathalbyn Town Centre revitalisation multi-staged project, the Goolwa Oval sporting complex and the Goolwa Wharf Precinct project. During the quarterly

period we have held village conversations to engage with the community about their vision for their townships as part of the A2040 process, holding sessions in Mount Compass, Langhorne Creek and Goolwa. We have also engaged with the community on a number of important plans including the draft Disability, Access and Inclusion Plan, and significant work has gone into the Wooden Boat Strategy for Council's consideration.

The new Milang Foreshore public toilets are complete and will be a valuable piece of infrastructure for locals and tourists to this picturesque riverside town. In other exciting news, our aspiration to 'Thrive' has come to fruition through

the development of the draft Economic Development Strategy 2022-27 and through community participation in the 2021 Alexandrina Innovation Challenge. We look forward to the winner of the challenge being announced in November.

The spring and summer calendar of events across the region caters for all members of the community. From art exhibitions, live performances, local markets and more; there is something for all interests. Enjoy and stay safe over the holiday period.

Strathalbyn Town Centre Revitalisation Update

Strathalbyn's Town Centre
Revitalisation project is
progressing well. The eight-stage
fully funded master plan will
transform the town centre and
draw people into this beautiful
and much loved township in the
Alexandrina region.

Stylish new wayfinding signage has been installed and provides 17 unique contemporary signs showing a mixture of directional, points of interest and historical information placed strategically throughout the township.

The Town Centre upgrades will revitalise the streetscape to help foster community connection through shared open spaces, landscaping and signage for both visitor information and historical significance.

On the ground works for Stages 3, 4, 5, 7 and 8 will commence in early 2022 and the \$10 million project is expected to be completed by 2023. With positive feedback received from the community, Council remains committed to transforming the township to see Strathalbyn grow and prosper.

The project will increase connectivity, create new greenspaces and provide an overall increase in parking throughout the town centre.

Goolwa Wharf Precinct revitalisation project takes shape

Goolwa Wharf Precinct is taking shape with the Chart Room restoration now complete. This is one early component adding to the broader Goolwa Wharf Revitalisation Project at the northern most end of the Precinct boundary. Funding from the State Government's Regional Growth Fund and Council's co-contribution has seen the historic building restored to its former glory and accessible for all with ramp access.

The space will be used as a pop-up venue for small business. It is proposed that the space will be available for use from 1 to 6 month periods, subject to Council guidelines.

The pop-up program at the Chart Room will activate the northern end of the Goolwa Wharf Precinct, encouraging visitors to explore the waterfront and surrounds.

The activation of the Chart Room space will stimulate small business growth in the region by providing a flexible and accessible space to showcase the region's goods and services and compliment Goolwa's tourism offerings and waterfront experience.

Another exciting Goolwa Wharf Precinct project underway is the Signal Point Experience Centre. A project working group has been formed including local historians, Ngarrindjeri Aboriginal Corporation (NAC), wooden boat sector specialiasts, the SA Department of Environment and Water and other key stakeholders to develop the content for the story telling component of the project. Council have enlisted an experienced event curator in Exhibition Studios to oversee the internal fit out requirements and content creation based on the story telling needs and mixed use space objective. It is exciting times as the project will progress quickly toward the June 2022 completion.

The Signal Point Experience Centre Project is funded through the Federal Government's Murray Darling Basin Economic **Development Grant funding** program (Round 3). Both the Chart Room and Signal Point Experience Centre projects build on the Master Plan vision for the waterfront location and take the Goolwa Wharf Precinct Project to the next stage. This project is funded by the Australian Government's Building Better Regions Fund, Round 4, the South Australian Government's Regional Development Growth Fund and Alexandrina Council.

Community Gardening in Alexandrina

Are you a keen gardener without sufficient space? Do you want to learn how to grow your own food? Or do you enjoy sharing your passion for gardening with others? Then why not consider joining a community garden?

A community garden is an area of public land, gardened collectively by a group of people, with the primary purpose of producing food. Community gardens may include shared garden beds where gardeners work together to grow

produce and share the harvest, or individual allotments where gardeners each have their own garden bed that they maintain and harvest.

Community gardening has become increasingly popular over the last decade due to the range of social, environmental, economic and health benefits it offers. Community gardens are recognised as havens of social interaction; and small-scale local food production is highlighted in Alexandrina's A2040 Community Strategic Plan, playing a part in supporting a Liveable, Green and Connected Alexandrina community.

Alexandrina is home to several community gardens including Clayton Bay, Goolwa, Milang and Strathalbyn. Each garden operates slightly differently, but all offer a welcoming place for people to get involved, grow fresh seasonal food, connect with nature, meet new people and learn new skills.

You will need to complete and submit an 'Application to Alter a Verge' form for any works such as planting trees, shrubs and turf; or paving, mulching or gravelling on your verge for Council's consideration.

Verge planting in spring

After a bumper winter, now is the time to be planning and planting new gardens and renovating established plantings.

Deciduous trees are flowering and sprouting leaves, flowering annuals are appearing and the first of the spring/summer crops need planting now. Addition of compost and mulch will help protect your plants into summer.

This season Alexandrina Council has planted approximately 180 advanced street trees, and several small reserve planting projects are planned over the coming month to take advantage of favourable conditions. Many of the district's parks and gardens are at their best, so it's a good time to get out and enjoy the open space and clean air.

In line with Council's vision of thriving clean, green futures; the community is encouraged to take advantage of the ideal growing environment and participate in urban greening either in their gardens or on the verge in front of their residence.

As well as being aesthetically pleasing, planting a shade tree or even low canopy vegetation helps to lower local air temperatures in summer by up to 10 degrees Celsius, reducing glare and domestic power consumption.

Trees also provides a habitat for birds, lizards and insects. Trees and green spaces are also known to improve liveability and identity of a township, and promote better mental and physical health of residents, leading to community prosperity and the associated economic flow-on effects to local business and property values.

Council encourages appropriate approved planting on verges. Registration is easy and the application form to 'Alter a Verge' and the 'Alexandrina Verge Planting Guide', for ideas and guidance are available on Council's website. You can download online to complete or collect from the Goolwa and Strathalbyn Offices.

Several community resources are also available for residents, such as the Alexandrina Community Nursery, Hindmarsh Island Landcare Nursery, Clayton Bay Nursery and Environment Group, Milang Environment Centre, the Strathalbyn Environmental Centre, and Cittaslow community garden to name a few.

Council is delighted to contribute to the business' success, and we hope to see visitors flock to our beautiful Goolwa Beach. The project also helps Council realise an important focus of the Disability, Access and Inclusion Plan 2021–24 for our infrastructure upgrades to implement accessibility for all.

The Economic Development Recovery Grant Program provided grant funding throughout 2020 – 2021 to eligible local Alexandrina businesses. The program aim was to assist businesses recover from the negative impacts of COVID-19 and associated restrictions whilst stimulating the local economy by supporting new activities that generate growth. A total of \$100,000 was made available across two rounds, Round 1 released in July 2020 and Round 2 was released in January 2021.

Forum participants shared our community's views authentically and honesty, and brought their own flavour and creativity to their presentations using visuals, story,

music and video. There was a great energy in the room.

The voices gathered so far were clear that our community values our friendly community, existing sporting and recreation facilities, social and community groups and our natural environment.

They were equally clear that to improve wellbeing, our community needs improved transport, a greater range of sport and recreation facilities, a greater range of after school activities for children and young people, accessible community information including in digital and print form, and more opportunities for everyone to enjoy the arts.

Forum participants should be commended for their deep listening to our community, particularly to the quieter voices, and for their willingness to take up the challenge to lead a wellbeing conversation for the benefit of our community.

Protect yourself – Fight the Bite



As the seasons change, most of the mosquitoes found in the Alexandrina Council area are simply a nuisance, however there are some species that can potentially carry diseases such as Ross River Virus. Please protect yourself and 'Fight the Bite'.

The mosquito life cycle is temperature dependant, and in summer a mosquito can develop from larva, commonly known as a 'wriggler', in less than a week. Council conducts monitoring, testing and treatment programs to reduce mosquito numbers, but personal protection measures are also recommended. The Alexandrina Council area is rich with history and each of our townships is accentuated by the unique character of our heritage buildings and streetscapes.


Gardens, landscaping and fencing, all play a significant role in either complementing or adversely impacting on the heritage value of a property.

The Heritage Advisory Committee are dedicated to informing the community about heritage related matters and annually undertake a series of educational talks welcoming all to attend.

There are many options when building a fence on your property and in September, the Alexandrina Council's Heritage Advisory Committee held their 'Heritage Talk' on the topic of Heritage Fencing at the Strathalbyn Library and Community Centre. The session provided some of the answers around what needs to be considered to enhance your property's heritage charm, from stone and mortar walls, to timber or picket fencing.

The Heritage Awards presentation evening is held in May each year as a part of the SA History Festival, with the next event scheduled for May 2022.

The event ensures that heritage industry partners, Government and the community recognise and commend finalists and winners for demonstrating innovation and best practice in celebrating the heritage of the Alexandrina region.

Discovery Park to feature local 'Aarke' wooden boat

The former sailing vessel
Aarke will be repurposed
and given a second lease of
life as a playground feature
at the new Discovery Park
in Goolwa.

Council introduced the Armfield Slip community group to new owners G'DAY group, who were enthusiastic and very supportive of the idea to incorporate the vintage wooden boat into their future plans to upgrade the Park.

It is fantastic to see restoration skills being honed to restore the wooden boat, as an integral part of Goolwa's history as the river port town and linkage to our South Australian Wooden Boat Festival, a world class event held biannually at the Goolwa Wharf Precinct. The next Festival will be held in 2023.

The boat restoration is a great example of community working with local businesses and will serve as a great tourism attraction as it takes pride of place in the fabulous new playground with the Discovery Park upgrades, due to be completed in late December 2021.

The G'DAY Group's investment in Goolwa will further accommodate visitors and introduce customers to our existing businesses ensuring creation of more local ongoing jobs, as well as tapping into the growing visiting friends and relatives market, a very important contributor to our local economy.

Major Project Updates



Middleton Tennis Courts

Council completed fencing for the Middleton Tennis Courts in September and the 'Middleton Moths' social tennis group and wider community are ecstatic. The project followed on from resurfacing of the tennis courts in 2020, with full replacement of existing fencing included new posts, top and bottom rails, new chainmesh and access gates. Council's field staff assisted with the works, including repairs to irrigation, vegetation clearance and site cleaning.

Milang Foreshore Public Toilets

In September, Council opened the newly completed Milang public toilet facilities. The project involved the initial demolition of the existing structure, and building of the new contemporary public toilets with accessible and ambulant toilets, baby change facilities, external shower area, solar system with battery storage, drinking fountain, external power points for community event use and new access paths from car parking areas.

Goolwa Oval Recreation Precinct

Significant progress has been made on the sporting complex with rendering, external cladding and internal lining complete. The lift has been installed and upcoming works will include glazing, tiling, access ramp and joinery to complete the first stage of the Master Plan.
