South Australia's population of Little Corellas has significantly increased over the last 50 years, and now State Government is seeking feedback on the *draft South Australian Little Corella Management Strategy*. The *Planning and Design Code* is also currently out for public consultation from 1 October 2019 and will extend until February 2020. The Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure is managing the consultation process. All set for a safe summer at Goolwa Beach

The Goolwa Surf Life Saving Club (SLSC) building was officially opened on 13 October by Surf Life Saving South Australia (SLSSA).

Alexandrina Council representatives joined Goolwa SLSC, SLSSA and other stakeholders to celebrate what will become an iconic structure to beach culture in Goolwa for years to come.

The \$3.5 million dollar project is part-funded by SLSSA through their Club Rebuild Program, Goolwa SLSC and Alexandrina Council, providing a new home for locals and visitors at our famous Goolwa Beach.

Goolwa Surf Life Saving Club has worked tirelessly for eight seasons, to make Goolwa Beach a safer and more accessible place for people to enjoy. Club members have raised eleven percent of the project funds to help establish this building, an outstanding achievement by this dedicated group.

This impressive new facility sets a benchmark for place-making in our region by creating an asset that will serve the interests of our community and visitors alike, supporting growth in the region. In 2019, Alexandrina Council proudly acknowledged winners from each category at our annual Australia Day Celebrations in Strathalbyn and Goolwa.

The 2019 Citizen of the Year Awards were presented to Sharon Pankhurst and Sue Eckert.

Sharon has been a volunteer at the Signal Point Gallery and South Coast Regional Arts Centre in Goolwa since 2010, where she coordinates volunteer rosters and supervises exhibitions, together with providing support for community arts events; while Sue has made an exceptional and significant contribution to the Strathalbyn community over the last 40 years, which has included being the co-ordinator of 'Christmas Hampers to Disadvantaged Families' in the district (160 delivered in 2018) among involvement in many other community groups.

The 2019 Young Citizen of the Year Awards went to Hannah Arnold for the Strathalbyn region and Carter Banks for Goolwa.

Hannah led a team organising the 'A Day Out of the Blue' community event in November 2018, a fundraising event to raise awareness of those who have suffered and continue to suffer from anxiety and depression. Carter has been a member of the Southern Fleurieu Youth Advisory Committee for over five years, volunteering at local youth forums on mental health, as well as forums run by the Youth Affairs Council of SA.

Clean and Green with Compostable Dog waste bags

As Alexandrina looks toward a clean, green future, we are proud to make the shift to new compostable dog waste bags in our dispensers across the region. Being compostable, they can go into



green waste bins rather than general waste bins, reducing our reliance on single-use plastics and total waste to landfill.

The rollout throughout August was met with enthusiastic positivity by dog owners who are keen to 'recycle right.'
The bags are also available to purchase at the Goolwa and Strathalbyn Council offices at \$3 for a roll of 20 bags.

A dedicated group of local volunteers has been working with Council over the past few years to design and install a series of interpretive signs at the Strathalbyn Cemetery.

The Friends of the Strathalbyn Cemetery group have made a number of recommendations to Council to ensure the signage best depicts the true history, characters and points of interest, which hosts a plethora of amazing stories dating back well before it's opening in 1856.

So far two signs have been erected, honouring the 'Pioneers of Strathalbyn' and the 'Common Ground' section of the cemetery. There are four remaining signs to be installed, which are for the RSL Section, the Roman Catholic Section and in honour of two noteworthy interments, Dr John Walker and Joseph William Elliot.

The Friends of the Strathalbyn Cemetery and Alexandrina Council will also collaborate to create an interpretive brochure, which is hoped to be released in the coming months, allowing visitors of the cemetery to take a self-guided tour through the grounds and learn some of the interesting history as they move between graves and burial sections at their leisure.
