## Storm Damage

In 2016 southern regions of South Australia have been impacted by record-breaking storm events, with extremely high winds and rainfall recorded. This 1-in-50 year event has affected the Alexandrina region's environment and infrastructure, along with Council's ability to undertake maintenance and improvement work.

During the storm events "business as usual" activities were put on hold while Council supported both the emergency services and the community. This required using all available resources for work such as flood mitigation, stormwater management, tree clearance and safety and access repair work. There has been considerable damage within Council's 1,300km of road network to both sealed and unsealed roads, including stormwater infrastructure. A majority of the damage has occurred on the 750km of unsealed roads where scouring and washing out of roads has been the most common issue.

Due to the gravity of the work to be undertaken, Council cannot provide any commitment as to when maintenance will be completed, but all available resources are utilised while the weather permits. For more information please visit

## It's a Team Effort to Recycle Right

ach day at Thornbury Park in Goolwa you will see the 'bin team' making sure the waste collection system for residents runs

Residents Richard and Roy, along with Maintenance Manager Bob Stilson, spend hours each week topping up bins, giving advice and getting the bins ready for collection day.

The park has a shared bank of bins for its residents, who have embraced the changes to fortnightly collection in 2016. Council moved to fortnightly collection of waste, recycling and green bins in July 2016.

"At the start not everyone fully understood the process," said Bob. "We have 109 homes, which would mean over 300 bins in the community, but we have 18 green bins, 39 yellow bins and 28 blue bins to service everyone.

"One of the biggest things I battled with was 'how are we going to handle this change?' The team from Fleurieu Regional Waste Authority and Council visited and looked at our situation and gave us options, which really helped."

The team has noticed a change in people's waste habits, with more people spending time sorting their green and recycling waste, as well as a big rise in the amount of recycling.

"Every change brings challenges but as a team we put some communication about it to the residents and once we had it started we helped residents with their waste," said Bob.

The key to the success of the new fortnightly waste system at Thornbury Park can be directly attributed to the hard work by the team and their willingness to accept change and make it work for all residents. "To go from a possible 327 bins to about 85 bins takes team work to make it happen," said Bob.

"I had to swallow my pride because at first I gave the FRWA and Council teams such a hard time, but it works so well. I never thought it would work, but it does," said Richard.

Since implementation of the waste changes, waste collection has fallen by 22 per cent, and both recycling and green waste collection has risen by over 30 per cent across the Alexandrina region.

#### What can go in my green bin?

Did you know all food scraps can go in your green bin? The motto for green bins is 'if it grows, it goes!'

You can also put shredded paper, tissues, human and pet hair, newspaper-based cat litter, wood ash and fallen fruit in the green bin.

Please remember, do not put any plastic bags in your green bin and do not put nappies in your green waste bin, even if they do say 'biodegradable' or 'compostable'.

#### What can go in my yellow recycling bin?

- · Glass bottles and jars
- Aluminium and steel
- Paper and cardboard
- · Hard plastics and cartons
- Clean plastic plant pots Empty paint cans.

Remember to rinse your bottles and jars before placing them in the recycling bin. It's fine to leave the labels on your recyclables. Any plastic containers that bounce back to their original shape when gently crushed are suitable for recycling. Soft plastics that do not hold their shape cannot be recycled and need to go in the general waste bin. Please do not put your recyclables inside a plastic bag.

# **Growing Mainstreet Mount Compass**

ount Compass mainstreet continues to grow with the opening of the new shopping development in November. This fantastic community facility includes a medical centre, butcher, pharmacy, Australia Post and IGA supermarket.

Situated on land kindly donated by the Arthur family, the new development together with the wetlands will ensure this beautiful area is preserved for future generations to enjoy. A large portion of the community land parcel straddles the Nangkita Creek, and forms part of the endangered Southern Fleurieu Regional Swamps and Wetlands. Council, in partnership with developer, Brujoh Pty Ltd, approved the use of a good portion of community land to assist with providing both IGA and community car parking facilities accessible via Sam Court. Construction at Sam Court has been enabled by

funding from State Government and Council as part of project works in Mount Compass since 2010 including the reserve wetland, mainstreet stormwater and streetscape, and refurbished public toilet

Everyone involved with the new development and surrounding streetscapes should be extremely proud of the beautiful aesthetics that the combined projects provide for both the community and visitors to our picturesque region.

Works will continue into 2017 to complete the project and include streetscape along the IGA frontage, Sam Court upgrade and landscaping adjacent to public toilets, linking with the wetland. It is certainly an exciting time to visit Mount Compass to see this beautiful town reach its full potential.

## Protect yourself against



Everyone would agree that mosquitoes are a nuisance, but do you know they can spread serious disease? The most common disease spread by mosquitoes in South Australia is Ross River virus, followed by Barmah Forest virus.

Currently there is no cure or vaccine for either virus. Therefore, it is

important to understand how to protect ourselves. To protect yourself wear long, loose fitting clothing, apply insect repellent containing DEET (diethyl toluamide) and use insect screens on your house, unit, house boat, caravan or tent. Mosquitoes breed in still water, fresh or salty, and often in puddles and containers. Some steps that can be taken to minimise numbers include covering water containers with mosquitoproof mesh, maintain roof gutters by removing leaves and debris so that pools of water do not form, and empty and refill bird baths or pets' drinking water at least once a week. 
