GUIDELINES

All plantings on roadsides require the consent of Council prior to any work being undertaken.

NOTE: The mature height of planted vegetation must not exceed 1 meter within 30 metres of road intersections and vegetation should be planted away from the shoulder or table drain so that when mature, it will not intrude into the traffic clearance envelope.

Council requires that the choice of species is site specific, in order to improve:

1. Risk Management for:
 - Lines of sight for vehicle/road users and access to road reserves;
 - Service provision and infrastructure maintenance; and
 - Bushfire prevention
2. Conservation of local indigenous vegetation and/or
3. Conservation of cultural and visual amenity.

Unless otherwise specified, Council requires that indigenous plant species, propagated from locally sourced material, is to be used in revegetation works.
