Local Government Elections 2022

Make a difference to our community

Local Government elections will be held in November this year and you could help shape the future of the Alexandrina region by nominating to be a Council Member.

Elected Members help influence and make decisions about what happens locally. They can be involved in:

- deciding on Council plans and policies for the area
- guiding Council affairs
- ensuring Council resources are used fairly for the benefit of everyone in the community
- talking to local people about their views and ideas for the area
- letting others know about issues within their specific wards.

To be able to nominate in this year's Local Government Elections, you must ensure:

• You are on the Voters Roll for the election.

Unlike State and Federal Elections the Council elections allow a wider range of people to apply to be on the Voters Roll.

If you vote in the State and Federal elections at your residential address within the Alexandrina Council region, you don't have to do anything more.

• You are eligible to stand for election.

To nominate and be able to stand for election, you must be an Australian citizen (including dual citizenship) and be eligible to vote in your area. Nominating for council is not restrictive to experience or qualifications.

The elections are conducted by the Electoral Commission South Australia, and the ECSA website has information for candidates considering standing for election. From the 10 November 2022, Alexandrina Council will comprise of three (3) wards being; Alexandrina North, Alexandrina South and Alexandrina West. The number of Elected Members will also change on this date with nine (9) Councillors and the Mayor representing the Council area.

If you have rateable property in more than one (1) ward you will be entitled to have a vote in each ward election for which you have rateable property.

Nominations to become an Elected Member open on 23 August 2022 and close at 12 noon, Tuesday 6 September 2022.

Community projects funded

Alexandrina Council has secured \$1.37 million in funding from the Australian Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) Program.

The LRCI Program supports local Councils to deliver priority local road and community infrastructure projects across Australia, supporting jobs and the resilience of local economies to help communities bounce back from the COVID-19 pandemic.

The funding will deliver six projects in the Alexandrina region, identified as priority local road and community infrastructure projects. Funded projects include:

- Randell Road, Hindmarsh Island
- Sunter Street Bridge,Strathalbyn
- Freemans Lookout, Port Elliot
- Currency Creek Bridge
- Bristow Smith Public Toilets
- Strathalbyn Cemetery Stone Wall.

Hindmarsh Island's Randell Road, between Tolarno Drive and Monument Road, will receive safety improvements of shoulder widening, vegetation trimming and other relevant road improvement works to cater for the increased traffic volumes. Randell Road provides west-east access across Hindmarsh Island and links the island with Goolwa. As the only access to Hindmarsh Island from Goolwa, it is important to increase the safety of road users visiting and living on the island.

Sunter Street Bridge in Strathalbyn restoration works will include repairing damaged columns and panels, and repainting the bridge in its original colours. The bridge was built in 1929 and is one of the main bridges in Strathalbyn, providing vehicle and pedestrian access over Angus River and the Soldiers Memorial Gardens.

Freemans Lookout in Port Elliot is set to undergo three elements of restoration including coastal protection from erosion, drainage upgrades and the restoration of the 1936 Centenary Staircase. Erosion is occurring due to the stormwater runoff causes destabilisation, vegetation loss and corroded embankments. The Centenary Staircase will also undergo restoration works to conserve it.

The **Currency Creek Bridge** restoration works will reinforce and preserve the bridge to visually improve the landscape and create an interactive learning space for the heritage listed infrastructure. The bridge has Local and State heritage significance because of its rare vertical laminated timber arches and is reported to be the only identified one left of this Six priority local road and community infrastructure projects will be delivered in Alexandrina

kind in Australia. It is therefore listed on the State's Heritage Register and has support to be restored to a 'pedestrian friendly' strength acknowledging the significance and allow people to learn and appreciate the historical significance of the bridge.

The **Bristow Smith Public Toilets** will receive an upgrade to improve the public amenities for the community and visiting tourists. The toilets have deteriorating over time and are in need of upgrade to provide safer and cleaner facilities.

Lastly, the **Strathalbyn Cemetery Stone Wall** is set to have restoration works to repair the deteriorating wall. During a recent Council Cemetery Review and the work undertaken by the Friends of the Strathalbyn Cemetery, it has highlighted the need to repair and restore the wall to further enhance and create a beautiful place. With heritage being something that our region is proud of, it is important to ensure our historic places are well maintained.

Work is set to commerce later this year with all projects to be completed by June 2023. These restorations will revitalise some of our much needed roads and infrastructure.

Heritage enthusiasts from across the region attended Carruthers Hall in Strathalbyn on Thursday, 26 May for the annual Alexandrina Council Heritage Awards.

Organised by Council's Heritage Advisory Committee, the awards recognise and celebrate the hard work undertaken by residents, businesses and community groups on some of our most iconic heritage properties, along with those who contribute to recognising and researching our region's history and heritage.

The guest speaker of the night was Ron Kandelaars, from the Seven Network, who engaged with the audience in an interview style presentation, speaking on a number of topics including 'what makes news' and 'how do you get heritage stories into a Seven News bulletin'. Ron also displayed and provided commentary on a number of videos from some of his favourite heritage stories he has presented to date.

Goolwa Wharf Precinct

TRUTTURE

The vision for the Goolwa Wharf Precinct is a place to experience a vibrant riverfront township enriched with culture and history. The revitalisation project is progressing well and has moved a step closer to commencement of construction works. The tender process commenced in July for the long awaited upgrade to the Goolwa Wharf Precinct following Council's March 2022 decision to progress a Master Plan approach, this is an exciting milestone for Council and community. Council's project team is continuing to work with the precinct stakeholders in the finalisation of the design and looking for an experienced construction contractor with a track record in this type of development and who can demonstrate an understanding of our community and its needs.

The transformation of the Precinct will turn it into a vibrant place of cultural and environmental significance; activated with events, arts open space to encourage locals and tourists to stay and explore the region further with the benefit of creating economic growth and jobs.

Strathalbyn Town Centre Streetscape

With three of the eight stages complete, the upcoming elements of the project include: High Street Precinct, Dawson Street Precinct, Swale Street Link, Town Centre Tourism Parking, and the Town Hall upgrade.

Stage 3 - High Street Precinct works commencing in July entails new footpaths along High Street, from Sunter Street through to Swale Street, along with street lighting.


Works also include: street furniture and plantings in harmony with the other stages of the project; and intersection kerbing and paving works at Swale Street/High Street, Grey Street/High Street, and Sunter Street/High Street. Stage 3 completion is on track for November 2022.
