## Mount Compass Recreation Park construction underway

The site has been cleared and construction is underway on the widely anticipated Mount Compass Recreation Park. Locals and Council are united in celebration for the commencement of works and have given the project the thumbs up and tick of approval.

The \$1.15m recreation park, located on a Council owned reserve between Anderson Court and Waye Court in Mount Compass, will incorporate the community's most anticipated elements, as identified through public consultation. These include a BMX track, skatepark, basket swing and slide, and nature play space. While locals will revel in a place to 'burn-off' some energy, the park will also serve as a stop-worthy location and detour from the main Victor Harbor Road as well as encourage visitors to rest and play in Mount Compass. The Park is made possible with the assistance of the Member for Finnis, David Basham MP, who helped secure \$300,000 of State Government funding to accompany a Council contribution of \$850,000.

The contractor building the park, LCS Landscapes, is a well renowned creator of skate parks and nature play spaces, and has previously worked on the Bristow Smith Reserve Nature Playspace at Goolwa and the Adelaide Zoo Nature Playground.

Expected to be completed by the end of the year, the Mount Compass community will soon have the vibrant community space they have been longing for – a place where memories are made, skills are learned and bonds are built.

## Strathalbyn Youth Writing Group

# South Australian Wooden Boat Festival Goolwa Wharf Precinct

## 27 & 28 April 2019

It's almost here! The 16th South Australian Wooden Boat Festival is now just days away and is set to be one of the best yet.

A diverse program, bursting at the seams, is set to provide an exciting spectacle for boaties and non-boaties alike at the Goolwa Wharf Precinct on 27 and 28 April. The festival committee and their merry team of volunteers are ready to welcome the thousands of locals and visitors who come to experience the magic and nostalgia that accompany the event.

The South Australian Wooden Boat Festival is a classic representation of Goolwa and the Alexandrina region, where culture, heritage and remarkable workmanship bring locals and visitors together to celebrate the boating stories of a historic riverside township.

The program has something for everyone with sailing demonstrations, a boat building competition, photographic displays, a children's pirate trail, parades, paddle steamers and more; occupying the Goolwa Wharf Precinct and riverside area. Jaralde Park will again become the festival hub of live music and local cuisine, wine and beer.

Established by a group of local boat enthusiasts in 1989, the event is Australia's only freshwater wooden boat festival and its unique location at the end of the mighty Murray River, in a town steeped with boating tradition, sets the ideal scene. The mix of on-and-off water activities, local food and wine as well as striking wooden boats is expected to attract in excess of 20,000 people.

## Ag Booms again

Each year, the Foundation for Rural & Regional Renewal (FRRR) offers funding to projects that aim to improve life for young people living in regional Australia via the ABC Heywire Youth Innovation Grant Program.

In 2017, Alexandrina Council was awarded a grant through the program for a collaborative project with Strathalbyn's Eastern Fleurieu School (EFS) and the Alexandrina Sustainable Agricultural Round Table (ASART) Advisory Group. Known as "Ag Boom", the project encouraged young people to investigate careers in agriculture by connecting them with local farmers.

Rolled out in 2018 and viewed as an opportunity to strengthen links between Council, EFS and the local farming community; the project provided learning opportunities for Year 10 students to gain agricultural work experience and develop job readiness skills.

Students enjoyed whole class farm visits, a week-long individual work experience placement with an agricultural employer, small group work experience to two focus farms and a soil sampling and testing module delivered by TAFE SA.

A showcase evening was held in November 2018 to celebrate the successful completion of the Ag Boom project and provide an opportunity for parents to find out more about the students' learning experiences. Student feedback listed benefits such as gaining knowledge and experience in the agriculture and horticulture fields, and learning about farm business operations.

A participating employer in the program said, "I enjoyed working with the students and they actually contributed to the day's work well. I liked their enthusiasm and refreshing attitudes. We would be more than happy to participate again."

Going forward, Alexandrina Council and Eastern Fleurieu School intend for Ag Boom to be an ongoing program offered to agriculture students in Year 10, recognising the benefits of students gaining practical, real-world experience in agriculture.

## Health check on wastewater

Wastewater systems have the potential to adversely impact people's health; unmanaged or mis-managed systems have the ability to spread illness impacting family, neighbours and visitors. Council's role is to protect public health by ensuring these systems are managed in a way that minimises potential risk. Wastewater systems with onsite disposal pose the highest risk and as a result, Council focuses on ensuring the correct installation and management of these systems. One way of doing this is to inspect all new installations of onsite disposal systems to ensure they are installed as required and where necessary, that the routine servicing is carried out. Another aspect of Council's efforts to protect public health is a focus on systems that dispose of treated wastewater above ground. If you are an owner of a property with this type of system, an officer may visit your property to inspect the system to ensure that the effluent is disposed of in a safe manner and that the system is being managed properly. You can help protect the health of your family and community by checking your wastewater system to ensure it is operating correctly. Do you know what type of system you have and what the requirements are for it?

Keep in mind there are many different types of wastewater systems in use across the Council area and your system might have different requirements than your neighbours. ## Gazania Free Gardens

Council's award winning 2018 Gazania Free Goolwa campaign is being rebranded in 2019 as Gazania Free Gardens with a particular focus on the township of Middleton. The campaign will encourage Alexandrina residents, particularly those in coastal areas, to remove gazanias from their gardens and roadside verges and replace them with local native plants.

### What is Gazania?

Gazanias are a common garden plant, introduced to Australia from South Africa. They are colourful and drought tolerant but also a declared environmental weed, which can quickly invade gardens, roadside verges and native bushland. Gazanias produce a lot of wind-blown seeds that can be dispersed many kilometres from the source. These seeds easily germinate and establish in coastal environments producing ever increasing patches of dense groundcover that chokes out local native plants. Gazanias can also re-grow from their bare roots, spreading into bushland through illegal dumping of garden waste.

### Get involved!

Council staff and community volunteers spend many hours each year removing Gazania from our coastal dunes. We focus our efforts on areas of high conservation value but need the community's help to reduce the weed threat across the whole district.

**1. Plant Swap at Alexandrina Community Nursery**  
(1 April – 31 May 2019) The Gazania Free Gardens campaign will

help residents get rid of their gazanias in exchange for local native plants. Residents can dump their gazanias at Alexandrina Community Nursery free of charge and receive 6 free plants in return.

### 2. Coastal Gardens Workshop

I want to express my appreciation for the support I received at the recent council elections. Since then the Port Elliot-Middleton Cemetery Advisory Group has been established and is progressively improving the cemetery landscape. The Aboriginal Cultural Awareness Project has commenced and is in the research phase. After several years of lobbying the government is now supporting the construction of a passing lane on the Mount Compass/Goolwa road. This term's agenda includes a Port Elliot master plan, traffic improvements to the Strand, a pedestrian crossing in Middleton, ongoing Main Road landscaping and road safety upgrades. More broadly, the Murray Darling crisis, waste management, youth and economic development, cautious expenditure and minimal rate increases are key matters of high importance.



### Middleton on the horizon

Have you ever noticed that the scenic lookout bench you sit on to overlook Middleton Beach is actually a limestone/concrete surfboard seat? Well, Council's in-house carpenter makes these at the Goolwa depot and there are two new installations of the iconic Middleton surfboard seats rolling into the Lorraine Avenue car park in April. This financial year has seen repair works to the Middleton pedestrian bridge and an extension of the stairs to enable safe access at Middleton Bay. On the horizon in Middleton are upgrades to the Surfers Parade toilets, upgrade of the Middleton creek crossing bridge and new coastal beach signage, which will see the replacement of metal posts to a recycled plastic post along our Middleton and extended Alexandrina beach site locations. In addition to planned works, Council's civil team alone have completed over seventy works and maintenance orders in Middleton. It has certainly been a busy first half of the year.

### Unsealed Road Maintenance Plan

Alexandrina Council is responsible for the care, control and management of all unsealed roads on land owned, or under the care and control of Council. This includes collector roads which connect and funnel traffic between townships, local roads that provide residential and agricultural access. Council will hold a community consultation from 18 April to 17 May 2019 to gather feedback on the draft Unsealed Road Maintenance Plan and associated documents. ## Did you know?

State Planning Reforms are underway. The Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure, in consultation with the planning and building professions and Local Government, have been busy producing and refining the necessary documents associated with moving towards the full implementation of the new Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act which will replace the current Development Act, by 1 July 2020. One of the key changes is the creation of one Planning and Design Code for the State which will replace what we have known as the Development Plan. The draft Code as it would apply to Alexandrina is proposed to be out for consultation in mid-2019. ## Major Project Update

### GOOLWA BEACH SLSC FACILITY

The Goolwa Surf Life Saving Club (SLSC) Facility development progresses on schedule, with both external and internal components and fixtures being fitted and completed.

The local café at Goolwa Beach will continue to operate as usual; however, there will be minor changes to the public toilet arrangement in the beach carpark in coming months to make way for the development of a paved area in front of the surf lifesaving club. Public toilets will remain onsite throughout the duration of the project until the new facilities are commissioned.

### STRATHALBYN SANDERGROVE ROAD

The Sandergrove Road upgrade is progressing, with the lowering of the sewer main and installation of stormwater infrastructure nearing completion. Construction of bike lanes and kerbing will follow. The landscaping component of the project has begun with the procurement of irrigation, plants and street trees together with the sourcing of garden bed materials and exposed aggregate concrete. This project is scheduled to be completed before the end of June 2019.

### STRATHALBYN WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANT

The Stage 1, \$1.6 million upgrade of the Strathalbyn Wastewater Treatment Plant has been finalised with the construction of a new 110-megalitre storage lagoon to complement the existing 120-megalitre lagoon. Stage 2 will commence shortly and will involve design and upgrade of the wastewater treatment facility. The total project is worth approximately \$3 million and services the entire Strathalbyn township's wastewater needs.
