A Fire Danger Season flyer has been included with our newsletter in your letterboxes. Authorities are forecasting a long hot summer with a high fuel load so I would encourage you to consider your Bushfire Plan. Council will be doing its own preparations, having recently purchased a new tractor with slashing attachments to assist with the maintenance of our parks, reserves, and roadsides so we are not solely relying on the availability of contractors.

Leading into summer, I am delighted that two major projects have been completed that will greatly enhance the recreational opportunities for our community.

The Beacon 19 Boat Ramp near the Goolwa Barrage was reopened for public use at the start of September. Rebuilt by Council with State Government funding support, this launch facility makes it easier for all water users to access the Coorong National Park.

The entrance to Goolwa Beach is also safer and more accessible thanks to an upgrade to the 4WD access track and car park area.

Again, this project received State Government funding. Council has managed to significantly increase available parking while making it safer for pedestrians, cyclists and motorists using this area.

I'll finish with some words of encouragement to everyone in Alexandrina to embrace the Santos Tour Down Under cycling event rolling through our region on 19 January 2024, finishing at Port Elliot.

The eyes of the world will be on us, so it would be fantastic to see all our communities along the route taking part in the Santos Best Dressed Town competition.

It's a great way to get involved and be part of the excitement of this world-class event.

Middleton whale sculpture

Alexandrina Council is proud to be involved with the creation and recent dedication of "Buttons & Bobby", a red gum sculpture of a Southern Right Whale and her calf by internationally renowned artist Silvio Apponyi, commissioned by the Middleton Town and Foreshore Association.

Association Vice–President Jen Watts was instrumental in bringing the public artwork to the seaside reserve after spotting something "bulbous" and whale–like in the shape of a mighty fallen gum tree on the Naracoorte property of her brother Peter Westley.

Council was able to help that journey financially through initial seed funding via a \$3,000 community grant and then through an \$18,000 public art allocation.

However, our in-kind support was important with Council staff helping the association successfully apply for Country Arts SA funding and to connect with Adelaide Hillsbased sculptor Silvio Apponyi.

Our planning department also helped with the development approval process, our communications team assisted with promotional support and our field service people helped with groundwork, preparing the site, removing bollards for the crane entry, removing unwanted material, installing the protective fencing and preparing the footings.

Middleton footbridges are a 'Go'

The footbridges are now open and accessible at the ocean end and northern end of Mill Terrace at Middleton.

Repairs to the damaged gabion walls adacent the ocean end footbridge will continue with minimal disruption to public access.

Work on the rock retaining wall, paving, stairs and landscaping has started. The staircase will be installed after the civil works are completed.

Additional access to the beach will remain in place during this time.

Both bridges were damaged in the November 2022 storm event.

Council is scheduled to receive a commissioned hydrology report on the Middleton Stormwater Catchment Area in late October.

Country and culture meet at revamped Goolwa Beach

Council marked the opening of its \$2 million upgrade of the Goolwa Beach Car Park and Environ project with an unveiling of some public artwork by Ngarrindjeri artist Cedric Varcoe.

Cedric's sculpture reflects concepts of family, Country, knowledge and culture.

The artwork was originally envisaged for the Goolwa Wharf Precinct but has found a home at Goolwa beach, which is now safer and more accessible thanks to a \$2.065 million upgrade to the 4WD access track, car park and beach entrance environs.

The project has been funded by Council with support from the Government of South Australia through a \$995,000 grant from the Open Space and Places for People program. Key features of the project include:

- The expansion of the car park to the north to provide 166 car parks plus an overflow area.
- Angle parking along Beach Road providing an extra 28 parking spaces.
- » A new 4WD beach access slip lane and signage.
- » Improved access to the beach for emergency vehicles.
- » An accessible beach ramp.
- » A new promenade area with shelters, seating and picnic settings.
- » Showers, sand rinsing facilities, water bottle filler and dog drinking bowl.
- » Wireless phone charging facilities.

- » Bicycle racks and lockers.
- » Horse tethering posts and drinking trough.
- » New landscaping with more than 1,500 native species seedlings.
- Water-sensitive garden beds designed to slow and reduce the volume of stormwater run-off, capture pollutants and minimise the risk of flooding at the end of a stormwater system.
- » A new shared path connecting the car park to the Encounter Bikeway.
- » The installation of lighting and irrigation.
- » Three electric vehicle charging stations.

Street tree planting

Around 360 advanced street trees and 40 seedlings were planted by Alexandrina's Parks and Gardens team last financial year as part of Council's climate action plans to make our townships greener and cooler.

Most of the planting was concentrated in Milang, Middleton and Goolwa after computer modelling revealed these townships had some of the lowest tree canopy covers in the district at 11 per cent, 14 per cent and 14.5 per cent respectively.

Around 120 advanced trees were planted in Milang, 87 advanced trees were planted around Middleton and 89 advanced trees were planted in Goolwa. A further 104 trees were planted in other townships.

An additional 200 seedlings of native trees and understorey vegetation were planted on the reserve between Seaview Avenue and Basham Beach Road at Middleton.

Native species dominated the planting schedule with some 60 non-native street trees planted in selected areas to suit the location.

Greening our townships was a priority for our community who took part in our 'A2040 Village Conversations'.

We have listened to the community and have completed a baseline study of the canopy cover in our towns and are now developing a tree planting strategy.

Work about to start on Goolwa Wharf upgrade

A new contractor McMahon Services has been engaged to deliver Stage 2 of the Goolwa Wharf Precinct Project.

McMahon Services is scheduled to start work on site in late October/early November.

Council has already purchased the specialist timbers needed for the refurbishments to the wharf structure.

Inspections by divers have revealed more work needs to be done than initially outlined.

The recent tender process has caused some delays to the project,

but the Goolwa Wharf Precinct is an important South Australian heritage site, an iconic tourism destination and a major driver of economic activity in our region so Council wanted to achieve the best value for the community.

Meanwhile, Stage 1 - the renewal of the Signal Point building as a multi-purpose experience centre – is on track and scheduled to be finished by the end of 2023.

As part of the initial steps in Stage 2, Council initiated a 'Register of Interest' process for leasing or investing in the 12 commercially available spaces in the Precinct.



The premises range from the modern Building One at Signal Point to the historic Harbour Master's Residence.

Council is now reviewing the submissions which closed on 29 September 2023.

The entire \$17.4 million Goolwa Wharf Precinct project includes \$3.75 million in funding from the Australian Government and \$1.25 million from the Government of South Australia.

Not one but five library options

Council has five library locations across the region.

Besides the larger locations at Goolwa and Strathalbyn, we have Library depots at Milang and Port Elliot, and a Library Kiosk at the Mount Compass Post Office.

The Library depots at Milang and Port Elliot are open twice per week, offering smaller collections, printing, PC use and Wi-Fi. They are used as pick-up and drop-off locations for library items for these townships.

The Library Kiosk in the Mount Compass Post Office provides a basic pick-up and drop-off service five days a week. Library members can collect borrowed holds placed online or via the LibrariesSA App.

SCOTS cater for coastal residents and are seeking to increase availability of transport for any eligible resident including under 65's.

HCT delivers support for Strathalbyn

and surrounds residents and will soon have extra capacity to offer transport in and around Strathalbyn with a car soon to be stored at Council's Strathalbyn office.

Depending on availability, transport requirements can be for social, medical and non-medical appointments.

How's That! Works at Goolwa Oval Recreation Precinct a corker

Work on Stage Two of the Goolwa Oval Recreation Precinct is well underway with the completion date on track for early 2024.

New practice nets were handed over to the Goolwa Cricket Club last month.

Built by sporting nets specialist PM Sports, the new facilities provide three practice nets for club training and a fourth wicket that is open to the public seven-days a week.

A new equipment storage shed and shelter is expected to be up by the end of the year for the peak of the summer season.

Work is also scheduled to start on the landscaping around the nets to provide sealed paths and irrigated grass areas moving towards the wetlands.

New public toilets at the oval opened in August.

This followed the completion in early 2023 of sports field lighting, a full colour LED multi-sport scoreboard with video capability, new 12m goals, 8m behind posts, rear of goal netting and AVTV installation for the clubrooms in preparation for the winter sporting season.

The southern corridor acrylic tennis and netball courts are under construction with spectator's shelters, court lighting and a storage shed to be installed.

The existing courts will undergo a refurbishment with new acrylic surface, spectator's shelters and court lighting to match the new construction for shared use scheduled for completion late 2023.

A new play space will be installed adjacent the tennis/netball courts in close proximity to the clubrooms and oval users, with no vehicle access, creating a safe space for children.

The Goolwa Lions book shed will be relocated to a new modern facility with easy access from Wildman Street or the Goyder Street oval grounds.

The boulevard entry from Hutchinson Street will include exposed aggregate concrete with advanced trees, shrubs, lawn areas, irrigation, shade shelters, and park seating. This is scheduled for completion in early 2024.

Smooth sailing ahead: Beacon 19 Boat Ramp now open

Following a \$1.9 million upgrade, the Beacon 19 Boat Ramp near the Goolwa Barrage was reopened for public use at the start of September.

This upgrade was funded by Alexandrina Council with support from the Government of South Australia through a \$650,000 grant from the Economic Stimulus funding program.

The project involved dredging, the replacement of the 40-year-old, existing wooden jetties, the installation of a new pontoon structure and the installation of lighting and signage to make it easier and safer for boat users to launch and retrieve their vessels.

Beacon 19 is one of the main access points to the Coorong National Park so upgrading the infrastructure was critical for community safety. Alexandrina Mayor Keith Parkes said the new facilities would enhance the reputation of Goolwa and surrounding areas as a premier boating destination.

"The new, improved ramp will also encourage opportunities to link Beacon 19 with the natural attractions of the Coorong such as bird watching, bushwalking, kayaking and other water sports," Mayor Parkes said.

"The facilities give visitors another reason to explore the Alexandrina region, and it assists our community to capitalise on regional tourism opportunities."

Major Project Updates



Horseshoe Bay Jetty, Port Elliot

The remediation works of the Horseshoe Bay public jetty are scheduled to begin late 2023 and are expected to be completed in early 2024. The project includes the installation of new stairs, cross braces, and piles and the reinstatement of decking. The use of a marine barge and excavator for this project will prevent contractor movement through the new pedestrian link.

Strathalbyn Town Centre Streetscape

The final stages of the Town Centre Streetscape Revitalisation are on track to finish later this year, including the Town Hall refurbishments. The project will add vibrancy and foster community connection through shared open spaces, landscaping and wayfinding signage.

Stormwater Works Tarella Street, Milang

A new \$900,000 underground stormwater system has been installed in Milang to control roadside water pooling in Tarella Street and Etona Court. Due to poor ground conditions, the reinstatement of the seal has been placed on hold until later this year when the area dries out and base compaction can be successfully achieved. Until seal reinstatement can be undertaken the trenching has been backfilled with rubble to the existing road surface level to allow safe vehicle movement.

Mount Compass Recreation Park Public Toilet

A design for a new public toilet at the Mount Compass Recreation Park is being finalised. Construction is scheduled to begin in early 2024. The toilet will add to the playground, BMX and skate facilities. This \$400,000 project will add to the family-friendly amenities in the park.

Nangkita Road, Mount Compass

A \$963,100 project to upgrade sections of Nangkita Road using special water-resistant materials in the pavement, is nearly complete. The current surface is temporary due to the special pavement materials needing time to cure before the final surface can be applied. Final surfacing is planned for application in February 2024.
