### Welcome to the Winter edition of Alexandrina Alive.

This quarter we adopted the Annual Business Plan and Budget for the coming year, to deliver a budget with a rates increase less than inflation and focus on completing the projects already commenced.

Some significant projects progressed this quarter include; final stages of the Strathalbyn Town Centre and Town Hall Revitalisation, the Goolwa Beach car park and environs, and Port Elliot's enhanced accessibility and amenities at the Horseshoe Bay reserves.

In May, the 2021 Village Conversations was awarded the 'Stakeholder Engagement Award' at the Planning Institute of Australia National Congress, a national award recognising initiatives and outcomes in implementing best-practice public engagement that achieves genuine collaborative outcomes.

In the coming months we will be consulting on Clayton Bay's proposed 50km speed limit zone on Alexandrina Drive, the long awaited draft Master Plans for Middleton, Milang, Port Elliot, and a revised concept plan for the future growth of Goolwa. As well as opening registration of interests for the Goolwa Wharf Tenancy Activation Strategy.

Our support for local businesses continues, hosting in partnership

the Agritourism Conference in June with Tourism Industry Council of SA.

We are also thrilled with the recent announcement of 2024 Tour Down Under Stage 4 finish in Port Elliot. This incredible event provides us with a golden opportunity to showcase the very best of our region to the world.

We continue our Arts, Culture and Events program and support August's Fleurieu Food Festival program, so I encourage you to get out and about to discover the region this winter.

# Climate and environmental actions prioritised in 2023

In 2019 Alexandrina declared a Climate Emergency, and in 2021 Alexandrina formulated A2040, Alexandrina's 20-year strategic vision. What we heard was a desire for our region to thrive as a Liveable, Green and Connected place for all to enjoy.

Council recognises that tackling climate change and environmental stewardship while maintaining thriving and liveable places for people is a monumental challenge – one that can only be successful if Council and community work together.

Because of these challenges we face, Council is preparing two key strategic documents, the draft Environmental Action Plan 2030 and the draft Climate Emergency Action Plan.

The Environmental Action Plan expresses Council's commitment

and articulates that we will be worthy stewards of the land and waters of our Council area. This plan sets the context, the opportunities, and challenges for making the changes needed to protect our ecosystems, and to manage and enhance our biodiversity, waters and communities.

The Climate Emergency Action Plan on the other hand is our key strategic document to reduce Council and community emissions within Alexandrina, to prepare for a changing climate and to seize



the opportunities on the road to achieving and maintaining net zero. Both plans assist Council and the community to act now to tackle the challenges of a changing climate, to protect and enhance nature, and to create a better built environment and a brighter future for all of us in Alexandrina and future generations.

#### Strathalbyn Bowling Club's magnificent mural

The Strathalbyn Bowling Club now have a commemorative mural painted on the old pump shed by local artist Chad Spencer, as another example of how Alexandrina Council's grant funding can assist community groups to capture their history in a vibrant, artistic community driven project.

The Club has a long and interesting history and some of those stories have been captured within the artwork. The recently demolished old clubrooms is featured along with a portrait of founding President James Bell, who coordinated the establishment of the Club in 1913.

Jessie Jones, also depicted, played a significant role as the first Secretary of the Women's Bowling Club in the 1940's and advocated for an extension of the Old Clubrooms in the 1950's for a dedicated space.

Also featured is a portrait of Dr Formby, a generous benefactor who provided finance for the second green and in his profession, delivered as a baby, Bryan Wagenknecht (far right), the longest serving Club member of 48 years.

## Enhancing accessibility, for a refreshing upgrade at Horseshoe Bay Reserves

Following installation of new playground equipment at Horseshoe Bay Reserve earlier in the year, the new accessible car parking spaces and path to amenities is a welcome addition to the Commodore Reserve.

Works included two new accessible parking bays (pictured below) and a footpath from the car park to the public amenities and stairs to Basham Parade. A modern new footpath links the car park to BBQ facilities and shower area outside the amenities, that has also been updated with new seating and a table setting. Council's Parks and Gardens team applied the finishing touches with the installing of new turf and mulch to landscape the surrounding areas. The Horseshoe Bay public toilet refurbishments, adjacent the bowls club, were also completed in July.





## Clayton Bay Lighting Updates

Following the Budget Roadshow Meeting and Dark Sky Information Session at Clayton Bay on Monday 5 June 2023, Council are addressing concerns related to the recently energised streetlights.

Our aim is to find a balance between addressing the concerns of our residents and maintaining the safety of our community.

Council continues to keep the Clayton Bay community informed of any further developments regarding the implementation of solutions such as turning designated lights off and the installation of SMART lighting and progress regarding the establishment of a sub-committee to explore International Dark Sky Accreditation.

## Major project updates



#### **Centenary Steps, Port Elliot**

The staircase was constructed in 1936 and restoration works to retain the heritage integrity were completed in July. The Centenary Steps, lower adjoining steps and pathway were restored at Freeman Lookout, with funding from the Australian Governments Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program and Council.

#### Strathalbyn Town Centre Streetscape

The final stages of the Town Centre Streetscape Revitalisation are on track to finish in late 2023, including Town Hall refurbishments. The project will add vibrancy and foster community connection through shared open spaces, landscaping and wayfinding signage to transform and draw people in to this much-loved township. #### **Mount Compass updates**

Following completion of the Mount Compass Recreation Park in 2019, next stages of the Master Plan will progress with the installation of basketball ring and public amenities in 2023/24. The Nangkita Road, Mount Compass will undergo significant upgrades over the coming months to resurface the road for this

important transport connector route in the Fleurieu region.

#### Goolwa Beach Car Park & Environs

The highly anticipated car park and surrounds project will be completed in July, with significant improvements made to traffic management, parking and beach access track at the popluar beach location. Exposed concrete pathways, seemlessly link the Encounter Bike pathway to our Goolwa Beach promenade. As well as installation of a dedicated lane for access to the 4WD only beach access track. The area between the beach and carpark has significant improvements, featuring two shelter areas, raised viewing platfrom and Ngarrindjeri public art to create a modern promenade and public space leading to our pristine Goolwa Beach.
