Australian Light Horse 100th Anniversary

Described as one of Australia's finest military achievements, two Regiments of some 800 men and horses of the 4th and 12th Light Horse Regiments charged the Turkish lines, saving the town and very important water wells that were primed to be destroyed by explosives. Only 31 troopers and 75 horses died in the charge.

The Light-horseman was brash, maybe typically Australian – but despite the behaviour was indeed, a soldier of the highest quality, and all Australians should be proud of them and their achievements.

According to the press reports a re-enactment occurred with Australian Light Horse volunteers at Beersheba, on Tuesday 31st October.
