Milang Eastern Fleurieu School art installation

The Milang Library Depot's opening hours have recently been established following public consultation with the tight knit Milang community. To celebrate and give the depot a new lease of life, children from the Milang campus of Eastern Fleurieu School have been enlisted to decorate the library's book return bins.

In November 2018, Council staff visited the students to give the brief. Each student was asked to paint or draw a character, scene or theme from their favourite book. The results are incredibly creative and colourful and will be collated into a design that will give the return bins an identity of their own.

The Milang community will be invited to a special unveiling BBQ at the library to admire and appreciate the works of our youngest generation of book worms. What will we see? Kenny Blake Festival

Strathalbyn honoured one of its favourite sons in October 2018, when the Strathalbyn and Lakes Tourist Association hosted a festival in his name – The Kenny Blake Festival of Motorcycling.

Kenny Blake was raised in Strathalbyn, attending the local school before gaining employment at Gilbert Motors on High Street as an apprentice panel beater. Ken bought his first bike at 16 and when he was 18 years old, he moved to Adelaide, and later Melbourne, to pursue his dream in becoming a professional motorcycle rider. Kenny was a natural and won his first ever professional race start in 1969.

An illustrious career followed, which included 11 Australian Motorcycle Championships, and race starts across Europe, the USA and Venezuela.

Tragedy struck in 1981, at the Isle of Man's famous race, the 500cc TT. In what was to be his final race before retirement, Kenny was killed instantly in an accident on the final lap. He had started from the back of the grid due to a mechanical fault and clawed back over five long laps, overtaking 103 riders and finding himself in 8th position before the accident.

This amazing career wrote Kenny Blake into the history books and put Strathalbyn on the map of motorcycle legends.

Motorcycle enthusiasts from Strathalbyn and beyond, came together, and celebrated the life of one of the greats with a range of motorcycle appreciation events across the town.

On Sunday, 28 October, the Kenny Blake Memorial Sculpture was unveiled on the corner of High Street and Grey Street by His Excellency, the Honourable Hieu Van Le AC, Governor of South Australia. The amazing, life-size sculpture was created by James Stewart and took over three months to build, using around 4,000 pieces of scrap metal and mechanical parts. James was duly commended for his artistic creativity and sheer ingenuity, resulting in a superb and unique memorial to the memory of Kenny Blake. The memorial sculpture was graciously commissioned through the Kenny Blake Festival organisers, with funding contributions from Council and the Kenny Blake Foundation.

Our region is blessed with a myriad of talented artists, supported by Council's 2019 Just Add Water Program. James Stewart will have a solo exhibition, Control Has Left Me, at Signal Point Gallery, Goolwa Wharf Precinct from 1 March to 24 March 2019.

Fire prevention, keeping our community safe

Council's Fire Prevention Officers inspect around 15,000 properties and issue an average of 1,000 legal notices in the fire danger season each year.

Leading into the 2018 fire danger season Council's Community Safety team tried a new and proactive approach in an effort to help keep our community safe earlier in the bushfire season.

A community education process was trialled with the production of a general advice brochure to assist property owners to reduce the risk of fire on their own properties. An advisory letter was also sent to owners of properties who have been issued with a legal notice in the past, requesting their action to reduce bushfire risk ahead of the pending fire danger season.

This resulted in only 132 legal notices being issued, instead of the usual 1,000 – an outstanding outcome which helps to keep our communities safe from bushfire.

Residents are encouraged to keep the momentum and schedule some time ahead of the fire danger season each year to reduce bushfire risks on their properties.

Did you know?

Almost 90% of the original native vegetation in the Alexandrina Council has been cleared and what remains is fragmented in small patches across the landscape? Managing fuel loads, including the selective clearance of native vegetation, is a key part of being bushfire ready which needs to be balanced against further degradation and loss of our local biodiversity.

With the exception of some large trees within the 1956 floodplain area of the River Murray, you can reduce, modify or remove all vegetation - including native vegetation - within 20 metres of your home without the need for approval, however in many cases, removing grassy and woody weeds will be a more suitable way to reduce fuel loads.

If you want further advice about getting bushfire ready whilst protecting native vegetation on your property, please contact the Country Fire Service (CFS) for advice. The CFS can help you decide how best to manage bushfire risks whilst minimising the impacts on native plants, animals and their ecosystems.

2019 Just Add Water Program hits the stands

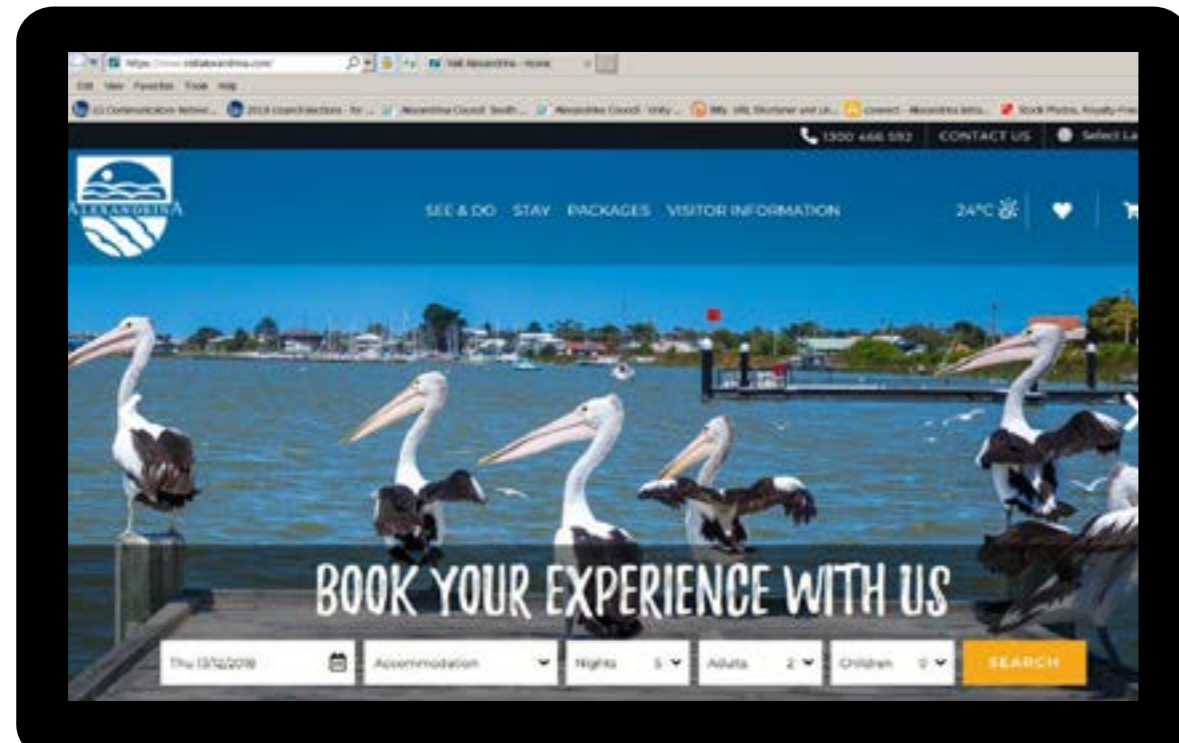
An enthusiastic crowd gathered at Signal Point Gallery in the Goolwa Wharf Precinct in December for the release of the eighth Just Add Water (JAW) Alexandrina Arts and Culture Program for 2019. An eclectic array of cultural offerings is available for the whole community, with 85 performances and exhibitions to be hosted throughout 18 venues across 9 townships in Alexandrina.

The 2019 JAW program presents shows in all major towns of the district including Goolwa, Mount Compass, Port Elliot, Langhorne Creek and Strathalbyn and is set to spark the interest of all age groups and backgrounds. Events include individual performances, concerts, workshops and school holiday activities; and numerous visual art exhibitions and installations at venues and galleries across the Alexandrina region, the variety and breadth of experiences to enjoy in 2019 is a feast for the senses.

Culturally significant Council events including NAIDOC and Reconciliation Week activities are part of the program again in 2019 and recognise the achievements of our people and embrace our rich cultural tapestry.
