As we adjust to our 'new normal,' we remain focused on our overall economy and are committed to leading our recovery to emerge as a stronger region post COVID-19.

Many of our residents and businesses have been hit hard by the pandemic, so we are working to reinvigorate our region and support our residents, local businesses and community groups to get back on their feet.

Our Community Grants Program has taken a different format this

year, offering financial assistance not only to community groups but also local businesses.

We have moved forward on a number of projects over the past three months. In September we opened the Business Alexandrina Hub in Goolwa, along with launching a new Business Alexandrina Program, geared to offer local business operators an opportunity to grow, learn and network with other businesses.

We also held three community consultations this quarter, and were pleased to gain significant feedback on the Goolwa North Growth Area DPA, the Strathalbyn Deferred Urban Development DPA and the Genetically Modified (GM) Crop consultation. The last of which resulted in a recent decision by Council to apply to the State Government to become a GM crop-free area.

We have also released landscaping plans for the Sunter Street and Albyn Terrace elements of the Strathalbyn Streetscape Project, with construction set to commence in December; as well as completing construction on the Strathalbyn Senior Citizens Building.

I have recently judged the Mayors' Short Story Challenge for our region, and once again, was very impressed by the creativity and imagination of our local students, reading a number of excellent stories.

I wish you a safe and pleasant festive season with your friends and families.

# Strathalbyn's Town Centre is paving a way forward

**The Strathalbyn Town Centre Streetscape Revitalisation project is taking shape, with funding for Stage 3 now secured.**

Council recently received Australian Government funding through the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCI Program) and at its September meeting, supported the nomination of the streetscape and public realm improvements at the intersection of Albyn Terrace and Dawson Street in Stage 3 of the Strathalbyn Traffic, Parking and Streetscape Plan to be the beneficiary of that funding.

**The funding makes way for Stage 3 works to be brought forward, with efficiency benefits expected from the continuation of works from Stage 1 works already underway.**

The project ticks all the boxes for eligibility as a shovel-ready project to be completed by 30 June 2021.

The LRCI Program funding will contribute \$685,920 and together with Council funding allocations will complete Stage 3, bringing the total project budget to \$1,935,920.

The progress of this 4 stage project is earlier than anticipated and will see substantial community benefit by creating shared traffic areas for adjacent shops as well as leveraging foot-traffic from Soldiers Memorial Gardens. Importantly it will also improve road safety and traffic management in Strathalbyn generally .

## Stage 1 update

Council recently released Stage 1 landscaping plans which will beautify the area around the Saint Andrews Church and include new street trees and garden beds, a feature stone wall, new footpaths and crossing points, plus a turfed area opposite the Soldiers Memorial Gardens. Details also reveal stunning red leafed Lipstick Maples and exposed aggregate footpaths. The Albyn Terrace streetscape elements will realign the 3-way intersection between Sunter Street, Albyn Terrace, and Rankine Street incorporating street trees, garden beds, water sensitive urban design, plus feature paving area with seating that will provide a meeting and resting point for visitors to the town as well as people exploring various the trails in the area. Construction is expected to commence in late 2020.

# Redevelopment complete for the Strathalbyn Senior Citizens building

**Upgrades to the Strathalbyn Senior Citizens Building are officially completed. The Strathalbyn Neighbourhood Centre will now commence management of this functional building, dedicated to deliver a variety of community development programs for local and surrounding residents.**

The upgrade to the Strathalbyn Senior Citizens Building was funded through the Australian Government Stronger Communities Grant, the State Government Fund My Neighbourhood Program and Alexandrina Council.

The redevelopment provides two of our prominent community groups the base and facilities they need to provide their much needed services to the Strathalbyn community.

Both groups are pivotal to the region and for many years have facilitated social interaction, access to community development programs and much needed support to our people.

The Strathalbyn Neighbourhood Centre moved into the new facilities in early September and held an official opening on Friday, 9 October.

The building has had a new air-conditioned extension added, while the existing building has been significantly upgraded with a new kitchen servery area and associated appliances.

External works have included the construction of concrete footpaths to provide formal access and aid in wayfinding from the car park to the main entrance of the new and existing building.

A new concrete pad has also been established for garden club volunteers, providing a location to install their garden shed.

Mayor Parkes visited the upgraded facility and is confident it will provide major benefits to the Strathalbyn community.

# Our Local Alexandrina Update

As a local resident or business, the Our Local Alexandrina platform is designed to be a 'one stop shop' for collectively promoting the incredible range of food, dining and shopping experiences across our region. At the same time providing a platform for those businesses who are embarking on their 'digital' journey!

Supporting local businesses has never been more important given these challenging times.

This initiative arose from the need to inform the community during the high level COVID-19 restrictions by which businesses were open and available for take away and delivery only.

Since then, the project has evolved to directly market and profile local business to our community and visiting South Australians.

When we established Our Local Alexandrina and invited businesses to register, we asked what challenges they faced, and how they were looking to the future to 'kick things into gear' now that the worst

of COVID-19 was hopefully behind them.

Speaking with Mel from Peninsula Providore it was clear the flow on effect from the closure of hospitality businesses had a huge impact on the entire local business community, however getting creative with the farm was a way to keep going.

"We provide Extra Virgin Olive Oil to a lot of local hospitality venues, cafes and restaurants which were all forced to close down, retail stores also lacked visitation and were forced to close. As such, our sales dropped around 27%.

We have created a pop-up shop at the Nangkita farm to try and capitalise on the number of people visiting the region looking for things to do. With restricted numbers able to eat out, we provide another activity visitors and locals can participate in whilst in the region. We have also been pushing our online sales, and social media presence."

There are now over 50 local businesses on the platform and this is growing monthly.

The introduction of the Planning and Design Code into the Greater Adelaide area, which includes Alexandrina, has been postponed with an announcement pending from the Minister for Planning, the Hon Vickie Chapman MP.

The anticipated new timeframe of late 2020 to early 2021 for implementation will ensure that the Code policy and the ePlanning solution remain 'best fit' and will enable councils, industry and the community to better understand the changes and therefore prepare for its implementation. It will also allow more time for training and testing of the Code within the new electronic system. The Code will replace individual council Development Plans.

## Croquet Club finds a home in Port Elliot

**The Croquet Club has relocated to Continental Park on the Strand at Port Elliot.**

Croquet was last played in this location in the 1950's and the club are extremely happy with their facilities, with their first game played on Monday 14 September. The club will continue to play weekly on Mondays and Wednesdays. This is an excellent result for the club; being a local community group, and given its history, it is a wonderful outcome that Port Elliot can once again be the home of a croquet club.

The Croquet Club were enormously thankful for Council's field services teams' assistance in marking the court, top dressing the area, building the storage cupboard and moved furniture and equipment.

## GM Crop update

At its September 2020 Council Meeting, Council determined that it will apply to the Minister for Primary Industries and Regional Development under Section 5A(1) of the Genetically Modified Crops Management Act 2004 for the designation of the Alexandrina Council area as an area in which no genetically modified food crops may be cultivated.

In making its decision, Council received a number of deputations at the meeting and considered the outcome and feedback received during community consultation.

Council's Chief Executive Officer Glenn Rappensberg has submitted an application to the Minister for Primary Industries and Regional Development based on the information provided within the submissions received.

The Minister, not Council, will make the final decision regarding the designation of GM Free Crop areas in SA.

In seeking this reinstatement, the Minister will only consider evidence related to the trade and marketing impact of GM crops.

## Milang home for Lower Lakes Rescue boat

The Milang Marine Search & Rescue Squadron (MMARS) has recently launched a new rescue boat to service the Lower Lakes, which is expected to result in better rescue capabilities and emergency response times.

The new, high-tech rescue vessel was funded through a donation from Masonic Charities and will enable more efficient rescue operations to be carried out on Lake Alexandrina, without having to rely on assistance from vessels based in Goolwa or Victor Harbor, as has historically been the case. The 37-year old rescue boat, Etona, has dutifully done her best on the lake and is operated by the Milang Regatta Club, but has limited capabilities in heavy weather.

Council approved MMSARS to take control of the lease of the Milang Pump House at it's August 2020 meeting, meaning a purpose built boat shed can be constructed and the boat can be at the ready by the water's edge. It is also on-call and available for SA Police's Water Operations Unit and the Victor-Harbor-Goolwa Sea Rescue Squadron.

The Milang Regatta Club will also operate from the new premises under a sub agreement, with provisions for food and beverage catering.

## Join the War on Food Waste

The Fleurieu Regional Waste Authority (FRWA) is working with several local Goolwa cafés in an effort to divert food waste away from landfill and into the green organics waste stream.

Mother Duck, Bombora on the River, The Grill Goolwa and Whistle Stop cafés started an eight week food waste diversion trial in August, with Kuti Shack coming on board in September. The businesses have embraced the opportunity to receive weekly collection of 140L commercial green FOGO (Food Organics/ Green Organics) bins supplied by FRWA. FRWA has also provided staff training, waste separation posters, bin stickers and recommendations to improve back of house waste separation.

Since the trial commenced approximately 24 commercial FOGO bins have been placed kerbside, with contents going to Peats Soil and Garden Supplies for processing into compost. Tim from The Grill Café in Goolwa says: "It's great to be reducing waste to landfill and helping the environment. I have wanted to divert food waste for a long time and it's great to have the opportunity to do it through this program."

Keeping food waste out of landfill has significant economic and environmental benefits and FRWA will continue to work on providing an efficient and effective FOGO collection service for small businesses and food processors across the Fleurieu region.

# Major Project Updates



## Milang Foreshore Public Toilet Replacement

The Milang public toilet sits on the foreshore of Lake Alexandrina adjacent to the main reserve car park which is frequently used by locals and visitors. This project will provide a longer life outcome and support tourism to this very popular lake front town.


The work scope includes demolition of the current aged public facilities and installing a new contemporary amenity with accessible and ambulant toilets, baby change facilities and external shower area.

## Clayton Bay Foreshore

As part of the Clayton Bay Master Plan the limestone rubble loop footpath in Clayton Bay is nearing completion. The path stretches over 2.5km long and connects people from the whole foreshore, ducks hospital and Dunns lagoon area. Works include a new shelter in Clayton Bay using a unique timber look aluminium frame, situated near the recently completed small car park along the foreshore on Island View Drive.
